MONDAY, AUGUST 19, 2024

Mark Mungeam called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm.

1. (0:55 TS) Mail/Orders to be signed:
(1:20 TS) Motion to postpone mail/orders to be signed to the end of the meeting made by Jim Foran, 2nd by Mike Greco. Roll call vote – Jim Foran, Brendan Doyle, Mike Greco, Josiah Burch all in favor.
2. (1:45 TS) Potential Conservation Commission Member – Possible votes
Kate Thompson introduced herself and her interest in joining the commission and volunteering her time to the town.
(3:15 TS) Motion to recommend Kate Thompson to the BOS to be a member of the Conservation Commission made by Jim Foran, 2nd by Josiah Burch. Roll call vote – Jim Foran, Brendan Doyle, Mike Greco, Josiah Burch, Mark Mungeam all in favor.
3. (3:45 TS) Open Meeting Law/Code of Conduct – Signatures
Matt Benoit stated that there is a packet the members need to sign on a regular basis and he will collect them at the end of the meeting.
4. (6:30 TS) Hayward Landing Dam Removal Projects – The Commission received a letter about the potential removing of the dam and they are going to put this off until the next meeting.
5. (6:50 TS) Meeting Minutes: January 22, 2024, February 12, 2024, February 26, 2024 & June 17, 2024 – Possible votes
(8:20 TS) Motion to approve January 22, 2024, meeting minutes as amended, made by Jim Foran, 2nd by Mike Greco. Roll call vote – Jim Foran, Mike Greco, Mark Mungeam all in favor.
6. (10:00 TS) Brandon Faneuf – Ethics Discussion
Brandon Faneuf explained the reason for him recusing himself from agenda items that involved Allen Engineering due to Margaret Bacon now working for Brandon Faneuf after leaving Allen Engineering. He asked the ethics commission if he and other employers had to recuse themselves and they responded that they have to fill out some forms to do the reviews for Allen Engineering projects. He also went into detail about what he needs to do and what the Commission would need to do in order to have other employees in his company Ecosystem Solutions to be able to review for the Douglas Conservation Commission.
(19:00 TS) Motion for the ethics discussion that Margaret Bacon and Samantha Karu be allowed to act on the Town of Douglas on wetlands review work, made by Jim Foran, 2nd by Mike Greco. Roll call vote – Jim Foran, Brendan Doyle, Mike Greco, Josiah Burch, Mark Mungeam all in favor. Brandon Faneuf went over the fee schedule for the 53G, Matt Benoit discussed the fee/rate schedule with the Town Administrator, and they are in agreement with the peer review fee schedule and 2024 rate schedule.
(23:45 TS) Motion to accept the peer review fee schedule and the 2024 rate schedule as presented by Ecosystems Solutions, made by Jim Foran, 2nd by Brandon Doyle. Roll call vote – Jim Foran, Brendan Doyle, Mike Greco, Josiah Burch, Mark Mungeam all in favor.
7. (24:20 TS) Open Space Committee Discussion regarding signage & trail maintenance for the Mosczynski Conservation Land – 77 Mumford St – Possible votes

Sue Perkins, chair of the Open Space Committee, and Becky Kalagher a committee member joined the table to discuss and explain what they are doing and what they are looking to add for signs. Matt Benoit will look into if the Conservation Commission has funds to be able to help make signs and help with maintenance for these types of projects.

8. (33:30 TS) Open Space Committee General Discussion for the Community Preservation Act – Possible votes
Sue Perkins updated the Commission that they have gotten enough signatures for the petition for the Community Preservation Act (CPA) to be put on the ballot for the November election. Ms. Perkins went over what would be needed if this did pass and what it means for the town.
9. (40:50 TS) Notice of Violation Cease & Desist – 31 Glen St – Lauren Maccagnano
Brandon Faneuf stated that a complaint came in that trees were felled within 100 feet of a water body and wetlands, and he visited the site with Mike Fitzpatrick and issued a cease and desist order on July 19th. Mr. Faneuf showed the Commission pictures of the site. The property owner Lauren Maccagnano and her father Richard Maccagnano joined the table to discuss and answer any questions about the trees that were taken down. The Commission agreed for the applicant to file a request for determination of applicability (RDA).

The engineer from Alpha Omega Engineering representing the applicant and went over the project completion and Matt Benoit showed pictures of the project and stated he has no issues with the project or issuing the certificate of compliance.

Mark Mungeam requested to have more details and descriptions on the plan to show all scopes of the work being done and already been done.

The Commission is requesting they shorten the length of the fence to 20 feet. Mark Mungeam declared the public meeting closed.

They found ledge in the test holes they dug requested by the board. Ed Avizinis with Avizinis Environmental and Brandon Faneuf talked about soil testing. Mr. Faneuf's recommendation is to approve the notice of intent and in the order of conditions; a special condition that the status of the isolated wetland behind the cut be monitored to the Commission's satisfaction and if it is not functioning as a wetland then some form of mitigation will have to be performed.

Brandon Faneuf updated the Commission on enforcement order and corrections made and stated the restoration plan is going very well. Jessica and Justin Bangston joined the table to answer questions. There was a discussion about weed whacking and turtles.

25. (3:36:20 TS) Birch St Enforcement Order
Matt Benoit stated that he does not have an update and has reached out to the property owner several times already. Mr. Benoit suggests that the Commission give him one more opportunity to come to the September 9th meeting with his plan and if he does not respond then they start issuing fines.

26. (3:39:25 TS) Lakeshore Drive Enforcement Order
Robert Moran 56 Lakeshore Drive and Scott Rolph with OHI Engineering joined the table to present a restoration plan and showed pictures of the site. They discussed the removal of the stones from the lake and making the least disturbance as possible, and the process, which the property owner needs to take for restoration. There was lengthy discussion about whether to have the rocks removed from the lake or to leave them. Janice Cahill 771 Northwest Main Street spoke about her concerns about the washout and the rocks in the water. Brandon Faneuf suggests giving DEP one more chance to respond and if they do not then the Commission should take action how they deem necessary to protect the resource. Jack Goodison 55 Lakeshore
